

Kindergarten Readiness & Play-Based Learning

4. Have your child cook with you or help around the house in some way.
5. Go on letter and number hunts and have your child practice writing their name with sticks, rocks, shaving cream, etc.
6. Talk about feelings and solve problems with stuffed animals or sock puppets.
